What an exciting year for Snowsports and such a privilege to be involved.

The club has changed its financial year. Reporting is now 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023. This year we had over 550 members comprising 72 Single memberships and over 160 family memberships.

Thank you to Cardrona /Treble Cone for supplying great membership benefits. Included in the benefits were discounted Ski Improvement classes and Master's training at Cardrona and Treble Cone. On Saturdays Cardrona held an on piste improvement/confidence building and an on-piste technique, preparing participants for Treble Cone . On Wednesdays and Saturdays Treble Cone held advanced piste skill development and advanced off -piste terrain explore programs. Masters training was supplied by Wanaka Ski Team coaches leading up to the NZ Masters races. These were the initiative of Bonny Teat who worked with the mountains and the members to help put the groups together. Everyone I talked to had an absolute blast and was thrilled with their technical improvements and meeting new ski mates.

Grants and Grassroots

It is particularly pleasing to see many of our previous grant recipients are now employed as coaches which demonstrates snow sports passion can lead into a career pathway.
